But you, Lord Jesus, invite us to more. You invite us to cast our cares, our concerns, our joys, our needs upon you. We give them to you... [Silent prayer]

Father, thank you for this time of worship. Be with us as we continue to worship and glorify you with our lives, our church, and our prayers. Amen.
